These activities would include exposed water lines, running water, trucks (other than Fire Departments) using water from a hydrant,

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unlocked gates, burnt out/broken lights at water towers, or any reason to auestion an unusual presence on or around the District's property. This will help us to ensure the safety and quality of your water and also prevent any possible disruption of service. All Rural Water District field vehicles are clearly labeled with the District's logo on both doors.

Please call 396-2552 if you would like to report anything that may seem unusual to you. Please feel free to report anything, checking out a possible threat is always worth our time! Also, if you are the first person to report a water leak on a District mainline, you can receive a \$25.00 leak reward.

Meet the District Staff

Rural Water District #15 currently serves 2,497 patrons with approximately 200 miles of pipeline. We have eleven pump stations, two elevated towers, one ground storage tank, and four standpipes for water storage. The District employees 6 full-time and 2 part time employees. We have an extremely competent and welltrained staff (currently having five water operators with "D" licenses, and a

"C" water operator license). District General Manager Jimmy Seago has been with the District for 5 years, Office Manager Kim Bersche for twenty-one years, and Field Supervisor Wendell Williams for fifteen years. Conservation Tips

Why Is My Water Off?

This problem arises occasionally and it usually means one of three things.

- The District has shut the water off for an emergency repair.
- You might have a leak.
- Or in the winter months, your meter or pipes may be frozen.

You can call into the District Office or the after hours emergency number to report the problem. The phone might be busy with others having the same problem, but keep trying. We need to know! At various times it is necessary for the District to shut the main line valves off to repair a leak, add new lines and meters or test pipe pressure. We know that this is an inconvenience to you, but it must be done and we do appreciate your patience and cooperation. It is impossible to contact large numbers of customers when something takes place.
